SNOWMAN CUPCAKES RECIPE

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 box of cake mix (any flavor)
 - + ingredients required on the box
- 1 can of white frosting
- Large marshmallows
- Mini M&Ms
- Mini chocolate chips
- Black decorating gel
- Cupcake liner



INSTRUCTIONS:



Prepare the Cupcakes:

- **a.** Preheat your oven according to the cake mix box instructions.
- **b.** Line a muffin tin with cupcake liners.
- **c.** Prepare the cake batter according to the box instructions.
- **d.** Fill each cupcake liner about 2/3 full with batter.
- **e.** Bake the cupcakes as directed on the box. Let them cool completely before decorating.



Frost the Cupcakes:

a. Once the cupcakes are cool, spread a generous amount of white frosting on each one to create a smooth, snowy surface.



Create the Snowman:

- **a.** Place a large marshmallow on top of the frosted cupcake as the snowman's body.
- **b.** Eyes: Use mini chocolate chips or black decorating gel to create the snowman's eyes

and mouth. Dab a tiny bit of frosting on the back of each chip to help them stick, if you use chocolate chips.

- **c.** Nose: Use a small orange M&M for the nose. Attach it to the center of the marshmallow head using a small dab of frosting.
- **d.** Arms: Use black decorating gel to create the arms, hands, and fingers
- **e.** Buttons: Use mini chocolate chips to add buttons in front of the large marshmallow.



Enjoy Your Snowman Cupcakes:

- **a.** Let the cupcakes sit for a bit to allow the frosting to set.
- **b.** Share and enjoy your adorable and tasty snowman cupcakes with family and friends!

As the story progresses, each snowman encounters a friendly winter creature or playful mishap, causing them to gradually decrease in number from ten to one. The book combines rhythmic, rhyming text with charming illustrations, making it an engaging read that helps children learn to count in a fun and festive way.

3. There Was a Cold Lady Who Swallowed Some Snow by Lucille Colandro

This bundled-up gal isn't playing in the snow; she's slurping it up as fast as she can. Raccoons, reindeer, and bears look on with stunned amazement as she gobbles up even stranger items like a pipe, a scarf, two lumps of coal, and even the branches of a tree. What could she possibly be up to?

4. The Snowy Day by Ezra Jack Keats
