PENNY'S

FLOWER PRETZEL TREATS



INGREDIENTS

- 1 bag of regular twist pretzels
- 1 bag of white chocolate melting wafers
- 2 bags of springtime M&M's
- 5 bowls to separate the colors of the M&M's
- 1 cookie sheet fitted with parchment

DIRECTIONS

- STEP 1** Preheat oven to 325 degrees.
- STEP 2** Separate the M&M's by colors into the bowls.
- STEP 3** Lay out 20 pretzels onto the cookie sheet.
- STEP 4** Place a white chocolate melting wafer onto the pretzels.
- STEP 5** Place your cookie sheet into the oven for 2-3 minutes. Check every minute to see if the chocolate looks like it's starting to melt. Once the chocolate is slightly melted, pull the tray out.
- STEP 6** Using five M&M's from a color, form a flower on the chocolate.
- STEP 7** Place another color of M&M's into the center of the flower.
- STEP 8** Let cool and enjoy! *Makes 20 pretzels.*
